### Sport at Uppingham

Uppingham's vision for sport is to create an environment where all pupils can achieve success in sport, from engagement and participation through to competition and performance. We encourage every pupil to take part in and enjoy the many sports on offer, catering for all abilities and talents. We believe that encouraging pupils to understand the importance of personal fitness as part of a healthy lifestyle is a key aspect of the education they receive at Uppingham.

All pupils take part in three sessions of sport each week, including a whole-school programme of games fixtures and other sports and exercise on Saturday afternoons. The younger year groups have their weekday sports sessions separately from the three upper year groups, which enables us to make optimum use of the expertise of our coaching staff, graduate sports assistants and visiting professionals.

The School has a superb Sports Centre and an enviable number of playing fields, covering some 65 acres. Dependent on the season these grounds can accommodate many different sports. In the autumn term, for example, you would see nine rugby, five hockey and two lacrosse pitches in use. There are also three Astroturf hockey/tennis surfaces, plus Savannah and hard court tennis courts, netball courts, fives courts, a shooting range, climbling wall, golf studio and an historic 1st XI cricket pitch.

### About the person

We are looking for a highly effective leader with a proven track record in the ability to get the best out of others. Accordingly, we want a first-class 'people person', who through their ability to listen, enthuse and motivate will create an outstanding team of coaches, incorporating departmental colleagues, teachers of academic subjects and external expertise – all united by strong relationships and sense of purpose.

The appointee will be a strong, dynamic and inspiring character with unimpeachable knowledge of sport, a strong (sporting) degree (or equivalent) and exemplary coaching qualifications. A track record of professional success, leadership and a demonstrable rapport with school-age pupils and professional colleagues is vital.

The ability to inspire others, communicate well, think flexibly, and to lead and work as part of a team are essential. High-level analytical and data-handling skills, along with the capacity to plan strategically for the long-term, will be essential to successfully delivering Uppingham's vision for sport in the 2020s.

An appreciation and knowledge of the wider life of a seven-day-a-week boarding school is a prerequisite, along with a willingness to take part in all aspects of Uppingham life.

### About the role: Director of Sport

The Director of Sport role is all-encompassing. A visionary, ambassador, strategist, motivator, organiser, performance director, diplomat, leader – this is a role that can and will encompass a great many skills and abilities.

In essence, the Director of Sport is accountable for the vision, quality, delivery and effectiveness of the School's sports programmes. The Director of Sport leads and manages the three deputy directors of sport in performance, participation and coach development and oversees the planning and delivery of all sporting events.

Most importantly, the Director of Sport ensures there is stimulating and accessible sports provision for every pupil in the School, which links with the values and ethos of the wider Uppingham community.

Although demanding, the Director of Sport at Uppingham is intensely rewarding. Because Uppingham is a busy boarding school the opportunities to work with pupils are rich and extensive. At the same time, balancing the sporting needs of the School with the demands of wider school activities (academic and social) requires flexibility and co-operative working with colleagues in the wider school environment.

Blending enthusiasm, high performance, and universal provision will be at the heart of the Director of Sport's vision and mission. At the same time, our vision f or sport will reach beyond Uppingham and draw in talented young people from all backgrounds, elite sports organisations, and policy makers. With the ambition to do something very special, the pyramid of Uppingham's sport can be truly outstanding.

### **Teaching at Uppingham**

#### **Remuneration and Benefits**

The Director of Sport is a significant position and the salary will be commensurate with the appointee's experience and the seniority of the role.

The School offers an extensive range of benefits including a school fee discount scheme for children of staff, free gym membership, subsidised medical scheme, excellent pension scheme, and free Westfield Healthcare and Rewards package which includes discounts in retail outlets, restaurants, cinemas and with holiday providers.

One of Uppingham's great community strengths is dining in house. Each day teaching staff are invited to lunch in a boarding house; a genuine pleasure in the midst of a busy week.

#### Life in Rutland

Rutland – England's smallest county – is located in a beautiful part of the country. Alongside the stunning countryside, with Rutland Water only six miles away, there are a mass of leisure pursuits on our doorstep.

The town offers a range of independent stores and its location allows access to a number of thriving cities and towns. Uppingham is equidistant between Peterborough and Leicester which have excellent shopping centres, and Leicester, Nottingham and Birmingham all enjoy first-class theatre and concert facilities. Cambridge can be reached in 50 minutes and Oxford in an hour and a half. London is an hour by train from Corby, Kettering or Peterborough.

Maidwell Hall, situated in neighbouring Northamptonshire, is part of the Uppingham Group of Schools and educates pupils from Reception to Year 8. Uppingham town has nurseries, two maintained primary schools and an 11-16 community college, with sixth form colleges in nearby towns, such as Oakham and Stamford. There is a considerable community of young children within the area.


